



Seeven uses for numbers in Scots

Use them:

1. As part of your classroom display to celebrate Scottish culture and events such as St Andrew's day and Burns' Night.
2. In a sequencing exercise with younger children.
3. In a game of 'Pairs' or 'Snap'.
4. As part of a '1+2' language teaching resource, where children match them up with numbers in other languages (see downloadable pdf).
5. As a numeracy task, where children complete addition and subtraction exercises.
6. In P.E., where children use printed out numbers which are scattered around the room in 'The Numbers Game' (see downloadable pdf).
7. In a game of classroom bingo (see downloadable pdf).
